Colleen May of Think Media Now joins Goodwill of Southern Nevada's Board of Directors.

Colleen owns and operates Think Media Now which is the first and only media training company in Las Vegas focused solely on preparing businesses to interact with the news media. Colleen spent 16 years in the news business, including 11 years at KLAS-TV in Las Vegas. She is a two-time Emmy nominated journalist, and won "Best Local Television Anchor" by Women in Communications at its Las Vegas Electronic Media Awards in 2005, 2007 and 2008. Colleen is also on the Executive Board of Safe Nest and volunteers with several other organizations, including Spread the Word Nevada: Kids-to-Kids. Colleen is married with two young daughters.
